A Year of Promise

January is named after the Roman god, Janus, a two-faced deity of beginnings, endings, and transitions. He must have been popular. When our family toured the Vatican Museum a few years ago, we saw several statues dedicated to him. The idea of the two faces, one pointing front and back, was to start the year looking back at the past and forward to the future.

Christians do not worship Janus. Rather we serve Jesus, our Lord who is “The alpha and omega” (the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet used to refer to Jesus in Revelation 1, 21, and 22). Early Christians had a similar practice of reflecting on the year past and observing a time of Covenant Renewal, dedicating the year to come to living for God. Even today, some Christians start the year by “chalking the door” with the letters C+M+B plus the year. While this *can* stand for the traditional names of the wise men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, it is an abbreviation for the Latin phrase *Christus Mansionem Benedicat* which translates to “May Christ bless this house”.

A new year is always brimming with promise. It's a brand new year, a clean slate upon which to write your life. You can start something new or quit something that's getting old. We often make hopeful resolutions with big plans for change. But resolutions can fade and promises to self and others are frequently broken in weeks, maybe even days. With God's leadership and help that can be different. We can start the year with blessing and dedication. We may ask the Lord's blessing on our homes and dedicate them to Him. In the same way, we can dedicate our lives to serving and living for Him. This kind of resolution is far more likely kept, especially if we ask for God's help in keeping our promise of dedication, a prayer perfectly within His will.

May God bless you in the coming year as you seek Him and His will for your life.


